

CHC40213 Certificate IV in Education Support

Course Overview:

The qualification reflects the role of workers in a range of education settings, including public and independent schools and community education settings, who provide assistance and support to teachers and students under broad-based supervision.

Some job roles may require tasks to be performed with a moderate level of autonomy and/or the provision of supervision/leadership to other staff/volunteers.

Relevant Job Roles:

Roles that provide assistance and support to teachers and students under broad-base supervision.

This may include:

- Classroom Support Assistant
- Special Education Support Assistant

Distance Learning:

Distance learning students can choose their electives and timeframe in line with the qualification rules for completion of training. Timeframes will be negotiated with the trainer but the Australian Qualification Framework (AQF) suggests that a student should complete this qualification between six months to two years. A My Qualification Plan (MQP) and Training Plan (TP) will be put in place to assist through the learning program.

Face-to-Face Schedule:

For scheduled course dates please contact our administration team.

Students are required to participate in a minimum of 100 hours of mandatory work placement.

Entry Requirements:

There are no entry requirements for this qualification. Students must be willing to undertake mandatory 100 hours of work placement and this will require a working with children clearance. Students will seek their own work placement and clear guidance will be provided.

Resources Required:

Students are required to have access to a computer (or use Alana Kaye's computer lab) to complete assessment tasks. Alana Kaye are conscious of the environment and where possible, provide resources and assessments in an electronic format. If possible, please bring a laptop to workshops.

Distance learning students must have access to a computer, internet and Skype.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL):

You can apply for RPL if you have the knowledge and skills gained through work, formal study, volunteering, informal or formal training, social activities or general life experiences. If you feel that you may qualify for RPL, please contact our office for further information about the process to demonstrate your experience and knowledge.

Flexible Delivery Modes:

Alana Kaye provides a number of options for flexible delivery of qualifications. These include a variety of different methods of training such as face-to-face workshops, distance learning, Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) or mixed delivery. Selection of elective units can also be tailored to individual requirements following discussions with the Alana Kaye team.

Investment:

Course Fee = \$3,440.00 (This includes \$400.00 non-refundable enrolment fee)

Recognition of Prior Learning = \$2,000.00

Students are responsible for the purchase of textbook/s relevant to this qualification. Payment plans are available.

Inclusions:

- Course learning and assessment material (excluding textbook/s)

- Certification upon successful completion

Payment Plans:

Up-front Payment:

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Pathways:

Students do not need prior qualifications to study the Certificate IV in Education Support. Graduates may decide to study a Diploma level qualification.

Course Outline:

This qualification comprises of 17 units of competency (subjects).

Units of competency can either be:

- Core units – units you must complete as part of the qualification and
- Elective units – elective units are the units that you choose to be most suitable for your learning needs

For our face-to-face workshops, we have chosen the elective units that we know are most beneficial and relevant to the majority of our students. These are the ones ticked below. If you would like to study different elective units, please contact Alana Kaye to discuss the options available for flexible delivery.

The CHC40213 Certificate IV in Education Support has 12 core units and 5 elective units to create this qualification. There are rules that apply to the selection of these 5 elective units. In the below table, we have identified the elective units. The rules are 5 elective units, of which:

- At least 3 must be selected from the electives listed in the table below
- Up to 2 units may be selected from any endorsed Training Packages or accredited courses relevant to the work outcome

All electives chosen must contribute to a valid, industry-supported vocational outcome.
